**Sydney Catholic Schools:

Qualifications to Teach Religious Education

Qualifications required to Teach Religious Education

(Category D – Accreditation to ‘Work, Teach & Lead in Systemic Catholic Schools in the Archdiocese of Sydney)

There are two ways in which Teachers can be qualified to teach Religious Education and therefore be accredited at Category D. In addition to this, Teachers of RE must be Catholic for full accreditation. Other Christian denominations, notably the Orthodox tradition, *may be eligible* for Provisional accreditation (with appropriate qualifications). Teachers with the Certificate of RE (CEO) or are accredited in another Australian Diocese, would normally be accredited Category D in Sydney Catholic Schools. *Teachers should note that to be appointed as a Religious Education Coordinator substantively (Level 1), a Graduate Diploma or Master degree in Religious Education, Theology, Theological Studies or a Bachelor of Theology is required. A Master of Educational Leadership does not meet the requirement to be a substantive (Level 1) Religious Education Coordinator.*

Method 1: Under-Graduate Study:

For undergraduate studies commenced from 2013 onwards:

- Undergraduate studies with 6 or more approved units in Religious Education and Theology at an approved institution of which one unit must include Scripture or Biblical Studies OR
- Undergraduate studies with 6 or more approved units in Theology at an approved institution of which **one unit must include Scripture or Biblical Studies.**

For undergraduate studies commenced prior to 2013:

- Undergraduate studies with 5 or more approved units in Religious Education and Theology at an approved institution of which one unit must include Scripture or Biblical Studies OR
- Undergraduate studies with 5 or more approved units in Theology at an approved institution of which **one unit must include Scripture or Biblical Studies**

Examples of such degrees would include: Bachelor of Education, Bachelor of Arts & Bachelor of Teaching, Bachelor of Theology.

Method 2: Post-Graduate Study (AQF 8 or Higher):

Completion of 4 or more Post-Graduate Course Units within an approved Religious Education, Theology or Theological Studies Post Graduate Qualification, at AQF 8 or higher. Where the qualification is a Graduate Certificate of Religious Education, it must contain: 3 Theology units and 1 Religious Education unit or 2 Theology units, 1 Theologically oriented Religious Education unit and 1 Religious Education unit. For a Graduate Diploma of Religious Education at least 50% of the units studied should be Theology and 50% should be Religious Education. Qualifications and the units of study outside of these requirements will be assessed on a case by case basis. If required a panel will be convened to determine whether the qualification meets the requirements of Sydney Catholic Schools. **All qualifications must have at least 1 Theology unit of study in Scripture / Biblical Studies.**

Examples of Accepted Qualifications Include:

Graduate Certificate in Religious Education, Graduate Certificate in Arts (Theological Studies), Graduate Certificate in Theology, Graduate Certificate in Catholic Thought, Graduate Diploma in Religious Education, Graduate Diploma in Arts (Theological Studies), Graduate Diploma in Theology, Master of Religious Education, Master of Arts (Theological Studies), Master of Theological Studies, Master of Theology, Master of Philosophy (Coursework) (in which the subjects taken are substantially oriented towards Religious Education and / or Theology).

* ACU also has a ‘Post-Graduate Certificate in Religious Education (PGCRE)’. The PGCRE is no longer recognized by Sydney Catholic Schools as a qualification that meets the requirements for Category D Accreditation (Teach RE in the Archdiocese of Sydney).

Research: Master of Philosophy (Research), Doctor of Philosophy / Doctor of Education in which it can be demonstrated that the research has a substantial orientation towards Religious Education and / or Theology will be considered for accreditation by a panel. **Both methods require the completion of the application form for Accreditation – To Teach Religious Education (Category D), available from RE Online. Email the form with Transcript of Results (certified by your Principal, Assistant Principal, Priest or JP), indicating the successful completion of 4 Post-Graduate Units in Religious Education / Theology to:**
